To the New Resident of Hartville:

We are glad you have chosen to re-locate to the Village of Hartville! We hope that the information below will assist you in making your move to Hartville a successful one. You will find information and links to the Village, County and Resident Services needed when moving to this area.

The Village government is divided into three functions; Legislative, Administrative and Judicial.

The legislative body is composed of Council which includes Ms. Kelly Ries, Mr. Jeff Miller, Mr. Ed Beverage, Mr. Jeff Kozy and Ms. Bev Green. They are all interested in all phases of legislative work and they have been particularly active in their Council committees, namely Commerce Development, Finance, Personnel/Handbook, Planning, Recreation & Parks, Safety, Sewer Rates, Street & Drainage and Zoning.

The administrative functions are divided into:

1. The Fiscal Officer is Mr. Scott Varney.
2. Street repair and maintenance, being administered under the Street Superintendent Mr. Nate Miller.
3. The safety is administered by Chief Larry Dordea together with his police officers. I think you will find the entire police force friendly and cooperative. In case of an emergency please call 911. Non-emergency issues you may call 330-877-2500 and the Stark County Sheriff's dispatch will assist you.
4. The fire protection is handled by the Hartville Fire Department under Chief Mike Lorentz. In case of an emergency please call 911, and non-emergency issues call 330-877-2478.

The judicial function is handled through our Mayor's Court. Our court hears minor misdemeanors and traffic violations. Other infractions are sent to Canton Municipal Court for handling.

We feel this is a very active and growing community with fine schools and recreation programs.

Zoning permits are required for new construction on commercial and residential dwellings. You are required to pull permits for additions, alterations, garages, sheds, fences, decks, tents and pools. If you are uncertain if a permit is needed, please call the office at 330-877-9222.

Building permits are required for new construction on 1, 2, & 3 family residences. You are required to pull permits for additions, alterations, garages, sheds, decks, roofs, siding and pools.

All contractors or sub-contractors must be registered with the Village PRIOR to beginning of work in Hartville.

As a Certified Building Department, all work (building, electrical, heating) requires inspections. Plumbing inspections are handled through the Stark County Health Department.
